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Buddhism and Science Videos Now Available

We are delighted to announce that videos from the Buddhism and Science Colloquium held in March are now available. This seminal series of videos was recorded during a 2-day colloquium on Buddhism and Science at Oxford University. It involved leading scientists, philosophers, Buddhist scholars and Buddhist practitioners in deep debate on the perceived convergence of modern science (relativity theory, quantum mechanics, systems biology, cognitive psychology, clinical science) with some of the traditional ideas of Buddhism (anti-metaphysical stance, interdependence, emptiness, no-self). The colloquium was organised by Vesna Wallace (Numata Professor of Buddhist Studies at Oxford, and Academic Director of OCBS), Denis Noble (Emeritus Professor of Physiology) and Alan Wallace (Director of the Santa Barbara Institute for Consciousness Studies).
